MATHS

Measures- Length & Perimeter: Measure in mm, cm and m, compare lengths or add/subtract lengths. Calculate perimeter in mm, cm & m.

Number – Fractions A : Understand fractions using numerator & denominator, use fractions on a number line and with scales, recognise equivalent fractions.

Number - Multiplication & Division B: Multiply and divide a 2 digit by 1 digit number using a formal written method.

Measures- Mass & Capacity: Measure in g or kg and use scales. Measure capacity & volume in ml or l.
