MATHS

Number - Multiplication & Division B: Times and divide by 10 and 100. The informal written method for 2 x 1 digit and 3 x 1 digit numbers. Measurement - Length and Perimeter: km, m, equivalent lengths and perimeters of shapes. Number - Fractions : To partition mixed numbers, compare and order mixed numbers, equivalent and improper fractions, fraction families, adding and subtracting fractions. Number – Decimals A: Tenths and hundredths as fractions and decimals, on a place value chart and a number line. Dividing by 10 and 100.
