English - The Windrush Child

This poignant story, written by influential poet Benjamin Zephaniah, delves into the history of the Windrush generation. Through studying the text, children will engage with the experiences of those who left behind their homes in the Caribbean and arrived on the shores of Britain after the Second World War.

Children will inform through letter writing, create expressive poetry, give advice and persuade through the development of speeches and a persuasive pitch to the local council.
