Welcome to the summer term at St. Andrew's! It has been lovely to hear about the children's happy holidays and see them returning to school full of memories and fresh enthusiasm!

Daily Routines and Reminders

Our daily routines remain the same as the previous term:

- PE takes place every Tuesday and Wednesday. PE kits must be kept in school for the whole week. PE kit: white T-Shirt with navy blue shorts. Tracksuits (in the same St Andrew's colours) and trainers are also recommended.
- Plymouth City College will be coaching Y3 sport lessons on a Tuesday this term. It is a really exciting opportunity to experience a variety of sports.
- If your child will be attending a club on a day that is not a PE day, I will ensure that they are changed before their club starts. **Clubs commence on Monday 27th April for 10 weeks & end on Friday 10th July.** Clubs will take place after school from 3.15 - 4.15pm and places will need to be booked via the school money system. Details will be posted regularly on newsletters.
- Please make sure that your child has a water bottle in school – active brains need plenty of hydration!
- Arithmetic, reasoning or mental maths tests will be sent home on a Friday, so that you can see your child's score. Spellings and times tables will continue to be ongoing homework activities and tests will take place each Wednesday afternoon. Again, tests and scores will be sent home on a Friday. TTRockstars is a brilliant resource for learning times tables. We use this in school and I would love the children to continue to use this at home as much as possible. Try to get a green heatmap!
- Spellings are always set on Spelling Shed, as well as being stuck in homework books. We regularly use Spelling Shed in school but please encourage your child to use it at home too – it really does have a significant impact on many children's weekly scores.
