MATHS



By the end of Year 2 children need to recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100, e.g. $3+7=10$; $10-7=3$ and $7+10=17$ to calculate $30+70=100$; $100-70=30$.

Please help your child with quick recall of their number facts for their weekly 2-minute challenge.

We follow the White Rose maths scheme and this term our primary focus is place value of numbers to 100 and addition and subtraction.
